Graduated from the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), Dr Gelzhiser's doctoral dissertation focuses on the gun violence on American college campuses through UCLA international students' perspectives.

Dr Gelzhiser has worked as a teaching fellow, teaching associate, teacher/special programs assistant, K-12 teacher and instructor across a wide arrange of geographical locations, including USA, Japan, China, Cost Rica and South Africa. He has the credentials in Preliminary Multiple Subject Teaching Credential: General Subjects conferred by The California Commission on Teacher Credentialing, and Level I Instructional and Educational Specialist: K-6 conferred by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Additionally, he is dedicated himself to research and is in membership with American Public Health Association (APHA), American Educational Research Association (AERA) and Comparative and International Education Society (CIES).

#### **摘要**
